Notice of Race

1. Rules

- 1.1. The series will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2. All boats and crew are required to abide by federal, state, local laws, guidelines, and restrictions for the operation of a boat on Saylorville Reservoir.
- 1.3. RRS 90.3 (e) shall apply, except that "24 hours" is replaced with "72 hours".

2. Sailing Instructions

2.1. The Sailing Instructions will be available prior to May 11, 2024, at https://saylorvilleyachtclub.wildapricot.org.

3. Communication

- 3.1. The online official notice board will be located at relevant https://saylorvilleyachtclub.wildapricot.org/.
- 3.2. All boats shall carry a VHF radio capable of communicating on Channels 16, 22, 68 and 72.
- 3.3. On the water, the race committee will make courtesy broadcasts to competitors on channel 72.
- 3.4. [DP] From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications that is not available to all boats.

4. Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1. Classes eligible for this event are defined as monohull or multihull sailboats with a minimum length of 18'. Boats that do not meet the length requirement may contact the Race Chair to be considered.
- 4.2. Any boat within the guidelines as listed in 4.1 is eligible to enter either class listed in registration entries 5.1.
- 4.3. Classes will be allocated to divisions based on boat type and assigned ratings into an Open Sport Boat Division and a Racer/Cruiser Division and Dingy Division.
- 4.4. Eligible boats may enter by completing the entry form found on the relevant https://saylorvilleyachtclub.wildapricot.org/ event page and paying their registration fees.

5. Fees

5.1. Entry fees are as follows:

6. Schedule for Races

6.1. Dates of racing:

- 6.2. A Competitors meeting will be held at the grassy area north of the **main marina** parking lot before each date listed above, at 08:30 hrs.
- 6.3. Number of Races
- 6.3.1. A total of 8 races are scheduled for the Open Sport Boat Class.
- 6.3.2. A total of 8 races are scheduled for the Racer/Cruiser Class.
- 6.3.3. A total of 8 races are scheduled for the Dingy Class

7. Venue

7.1. The location for the race will be the navigable water on Saylorville Lake between the dam and bridge.

8. Courses

- 8.1. Courses for the Open Sport Boat Class will be windward/leeward courses. Course diagrams will be provided in the Sailing Instructions.
- 8.2. Courses for Racer/Cruiser boats will be a windward/leeward course (multiple races held) or a single distance race utilizing the length of the lake and drop marks.

9. Penalty System

9.1. RRS Appendix V shall apply.

10. Scoring

- 10.1. A boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores.
- 10.2. Each boat shall be assigned a rating by the Organizing Authority, that is based on the PHRF rating system. Ratings will be based on the MWPHRF rating database. Participants may present a valid MWPHRF certificate, but a certificate is not required. If a boat does not have a MWPHRF rating the OA will assign a rating, based on information available on the US Sailing PHRF web page.
- 10.2.1. Corrected times will be calculated using Time-on-Time correction, using the correction factor appropriate for average conditions.
- 10.2.2. Any One Design (OD) class of 4 or more boats sailing under their respective OD class rules may be given their own Start.
- 10.2.3. One race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

11. Risk Statement

11.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and

acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury by or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia, or other causes.

11.2. Competitors participate in this event entirely at their own risk. See rule 3, Decision to Race. The race organizers (organizing authority, race committee, protest committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the events.

12. Insurance

12.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum coverage of \$300,000 per incident or the equivalent.

13. Prizes

- 13.1. Each division shall receive trophies for 1st and 2nd place.
- 13.2. A travelling trophy will be awarded to the boat with the best overall corrected time within the Open Sport Boat Class.
- 13.3. A travelling trophy will be awarded to the boat with the best overall corrected time within the Racer/Cruiser, Dingy class.
